Alberobello lies in Puglia in the province of Bari and has a bit more that 10 000 inhabitants.

The city is mainly known for its trulli (limestone houses with conical roofs). UNESCO has the city and its trulli on the world heritage list. The main income is tourism. Trulli were built as living houses and as storehouses. They are built of stone without use of mortar. One of the popular theories why this building method came into being is that it was not alowed to build permanent dwellings. The stone houses could quickly be dismantled if there was an inspection. Later this advantage shall have been used to avoid taxation. It is known that it was utilized in 1744 when the king of Neaples sent tax inspectors there.


Trulli have walls that are vertical at the bottom, but the upper part and the roofs are conical shaped. The walls are thick, one and a half to almost two meters, which contribute to keep the heat outside in the summer and inside in the winter. Trulli have as a rule one room.


