
BRUSÆTRA THE 14. MAY 2015










There is reindeer moss in the area.






This is a chaga mushroom growing on birch. It is considered to be medically, and there is sold many health products that are made of this.

From Svullrya we drove back towards <u>Kongsvinger</u>. Here we come to <u>the Glomma</u> just north of Kongsvinger.



Once <u>Hov church</u> was standing here. It was probably a stave church that was built before 1227. It stood so close to Glomma that water stood up on the walls during spring flood flows. A new church was placed under the fortress, and it was inaugurated in 1699.

The old Hov church was demolished before 1730.



Here we walk further down along the Glomma where there once stood a small fortification, Nor sconce.

It was built in 1718.

The first fort was Tråstad stronghold on the western side of Glomma which stood ready in 1658. Later Kongsvinger fortress built in the years 1673-1784.



There are some small islands out in the Glomma here.
