## TRIP TO ENGLAND 7. - 18. AUGUST 2014

We mentioned for Anni and Eldor Fjermestad that we were on a channel boat trip in England in 2011 They said that they also had wanted to do that, but it had not been, and they would rather not travel alone. We said that we could accompany them, but they had to work with the locks, because the time we traveled, Anne Berit got a hernia. It comes back when she strives. They promised to take the locks, and we agreed to travel in August this year.



I completed the <u>The Cheshire Ring</u> in 1992, and in 2011 I and Anne Berit traveled <u>The Black Country Ring</u> near Birmingham. I therefore looked for another suitable round trip. Norwegian has direct flights from Norway to Manchester, so it was quite convenient to go there and travel <u>The Four Counties Ring</u>. It is marked on the map on the left.

Anne Berit's brother, Asbjørn has moved from USA to Manchester, so we could then visit him on the same trip.



We made a reservation at <u>Middlewich Narrowboats</u>. This company is in <u>Middlewich</u>, and it is not far from the airport in Manchester. The boat is called <u>Ellsmere</u> <u>Navigator</u>.



The 7<sup>th</sup> of August we took a taxi to the station in Kongsvinger, when we took the bus to Oslo Airport Gardermoen.

There we checked in at <u>Radisson Blue Gardermoen</u>. We had a nice dinner with wine in the evening.



The next day, the 8<sup>th</sup>, we had to get up early to take the plane to Manchester. We went with <u>Norwegian</u>. This flight went via Stavanger Airport Sola, so we had to change plane there.

While we were waiting for the departure, we got several notifications about delays. In the end we didn't believe we should catch the plane from Stavanger, Sola. We just made it. When we reached the gate we were the last ones who went to the plane.

Eldor and Anni had had also booked the same plane, so I had asked them to ask the personnel in the gate if they would wait for us. They did so, but it turned out not to be necessary to wait.

We stayed at <u>Kinderton House Hotel</u>. It has a large patio in the back.




In the restaurant in the evening. I take the picture.

Finally, it is one of the guests who take a picture of us all. It was quite crowded with people throughout the evening,




A little later came a band that played dance music. It was just us dancing, and it was popular.

There were also a lot of swans. Here is one of them.




The cows are grazing along the canal.



Here we go again. Next lock.




There were several such cuts as the channel goes through. There is a huge effort that is put into getting the channels in place.



Lunch. Mmmm!



Here we have finished shopping and I'm arranging the goods in the bags.




We had planned to eat at the pub, but they did not have dinner on Mondays, so it was to make dinner on the boat again.
