
ISLAND 11. JULI - 18. JULI

Viti lies in the <u>Krafla</u> caldera, which is 10 km in diameter.




Next stop is <u>Viti</u>. IT is a crater with a lake in the center. It was formed during the eruption in 1724, which lasted for many years afterwards.







A bit further ahead we see at the right <u>Hrossaborg</u>, which is a crater. <u>Link</u>. To the left in the background we can see Herðubreið.


















There were some plants here anyway.

We went a little round along the river which flows into the bay.














Bright colors on the houses.



This is a memorial stone for the Norwegian Otto Andreas Wathne, which accounted for herring fishing in Iceland.
















Then we drove back to Egistatan over the moentum.

This was the breakfast that was prepared for us.




A small detour to Breiðdalsvik. The ship is in the field.

Garden outside.



A waterfall that we do not know the name of.




Not good visibility in the rain.
