The 3rd trip this year went to Crete. We booked flights with <u>Norwegian</u>. We booked the apartment in Crete via <u>Booking.com</u>. We no longer had to fill out an entry form, but we still had to have a valid vaccine passport. We drove to Gardermoen on April 4 and dropped the car off at <u>Dalen Parkering</u>. Dalen Parkering has a bus that runs to and from the airport, <u>Oslo Airport Gardermoen</u>. We were not to leave until the next day, but the plane was to leave so early that we thought it was most comfortable to spend the night at Gardermoen.




This is also within walking distance of the terminal.

The airport is named after Ioannis Daskalogiannis, a rebel from Crete who fought against the Ottoman Empire in the 18th century. The airport is also used by the Greek Air Force, and by the United States. The Norwegian F16 task force for air operations over Libya was stationed here.



This time we were going to stay in Platanias which is marked with a square. To the right in the picture, the airport is also marked.

The hotel had arranged a taxi for us, so the driver was ready with a note with our name on it.




Platanias is a village located 10 km west of Chania and it is one of the most famous resorts in Crete. Platanias are named after the plane trees that grow here.

We were going to stay in the old town of Pano Platanias which is located on a hill within the coastal town of Kato Platanias.

Kleftiko is said to be named after the Klepts, who were groups who fought against Ottoman rule in Greece between the fourteenth and nineteenth centuries. They lived in the mountains and stole sheep that they cooked on coal in a covered hole or underground pit to avoid being discovered.



The island we see off the coast is called <u>Agii Theodori</u>. It is protected and is used today as a reserve for the Cretan mountain goats, <u>Kri-kri</u>. They are found only in the Samaria Gorge and on two other islands off Crete.

Many legends have been told about the creation of the island. The most common story says that in early Christian times the island did not exist at all. One day, the inhabitants saw a large monster and their baby approaching Crete, ready to attack.


The locals threw spears and arrows from far away to kill them, but it did not help. The terrified women began to pray to the saints to survive. Their prayers were heard and both monsters were petrified, creating the two Theodori Islands.

It is allowed to land on the island only once every spring, and a caretaker lives in this house.
