


This is the westernmost tip of the cape that Split is situated on.

Brač is the third largest island in the Adriatic and has the highest mountain, Vidova Gora or St. Vid, which is 778m high. There live about 14,000 people on Brač. The island has its own airport, Bol Airport. The economy is mainly based on tourism as well as the production of wine, olives and figs. From ancient times, the island was famous for its goats. The island is also known for the production of white stone.



On the island of Brač we had booked an apartment via Booking.com called <u>Apartments Renata</u>.



The apartment is located on the outskirts of the little place called <u>Pučišća</u>. The town has about 2000 inhabitants. <u>Pučišća</u> is known for its stone production and most of the houses on the premises is built of local stone. There are also a large production of olive oil, wine and figs. In recent years, the tourism industry increased

Tuesday, July the 28th, we went for a trip on the south and east coast of Brač. Here we are in Bol, looking down to the marian.




A couple of tourist boats are out in the harbor. Bol is the oldest village on Brač.



Then to <u>Dračevica</u>.




The next place is **Donji Humac**.
