SANTORINI 21. – 28. MAY 2022

We found out that we were going to take a trip to Santorini in Greece. To get there without having to change planes several times, we had to travel with a tour operator who has direct flights. We chose to fly with <u>Apollo</u>. The company was started in Sweden in 1986 with a branch in Norway from 1998. On the trip we booked, they had chartered a plane from <u>SAS</u>. The plane left Oslo Airport Gardermoen at 06.50, so we drove to Gardermoen on 20 May and parked the car at <u>Dalen Parkering</u>. They have transfer to and from the airport. We spent the night at <u>Radisson Red</u>, <u>Oslo Airport</u>. It is located just a few hundred meters from the terminal.

The plane left at the scheduled time. The flight time to Santorini was just under four hours. We landed there at 11.55.



Santorini International Airport. The airport opened in 1972 and is the largest airport on the Cyclades archipelago.

Santorini is the largest and southernmost of the islands in the <u>Cyclades</u> archipelago. The island got its Italian name in the 13th century. Before that it had different names. The old name Thera was used again throughout the 19th century. People lived there before the year 3000 BC. Santorini became part of the <u>Minoan civilization</u> of Crete. There was a large volcanic eruption on the island in 1628 BC. As a result, a large part of the island sank in the sea and a major tsunami swept across the Mediterranean. It went down with the Minoan civilization after this and it ended around 1100 BC. Santorini is today part of the remaining crater. After the volcanic eruption, the island was uninhabited for a long time. Eventually, <u>Dorian</u> Greeks settled on the island.

Today there are about 16,000 permanent residents here, but it is a popular tourist destination so in the summer there are also many tourists.

There are a few relics from ancient times on Santorini:


<u>Akrotiri</u>

Ancient Thera

Akrotiri is a Minoan Bronze Age settlement. The settlement was destroyed by the volcanic eruption in 1628 BC and buried in volcanic ash. The site has been investigated and archaeologically excavated since 1967. Akrotiri is the only Minoan settlement discovered outside Crete.

It is an ancient city that was inhabited from the 800s BC. and until 726 AD. The area is located on a hill, Mesa Vouno, between the villages of Kamari and Perissa. Here are the ruins of shrines, an agora, a theater, a gymnasium,



We had flight only with Apollo and booked the hotel via Booking.com. The hotel is called Alesahne Beach Hotel

and is located on the beach in <u>Kamari</u>, located east of the island, just south of the airport. Kamari is perhaps the largest resort on Santorini. It is best known for the black lava sand on the beach. It starts at the foot of the Mesa Vouno mountain and heads north towards the airport. There is a promenade along the entire beach.

Besides, there was far too few onions in the dish. This evening the chef was not so lucky with the food.

There were many guests at the restaurant.





It is soon sunset.








Then we are on our way back to where we have agreed that the taxi would meet us to take us back to Kamari.

The restaurant owner had a dog that I had to scratch a little behind the ear.




When we went home on Saturday, Anne Berit took this picture of the church in Monolithos. We see it from the airport terminal.
