


After having been in Alcázar we went back to the cathedral to have a look inside.












Post card of [Giralda](#) with the cathedral to the left.













This is the sarcophagus of [Christofer Columbus](#), carried by the kings of Castile, Leon, Aragon and Navarre.

After the lunch we had a sightseeing tour by horse and coach.





The university with over 70 000 students.









There is a large park outside.



