

SKIATHOS 27. AUGUST – 3. SEPTEMBER

We found out that we wanted to go to Skiathos. We found a last minute offer on [VING](#). As usual, such charter trips go early in the morning. We therefore booked accommodation at the [Park Inn by Radisson Oslo Airport Hotel West](#) and space for the car at [Gardermoen Parkering](#). The week before, we were at Samos. Then we also spent the night here and we have pictures from the hotel on that travel letter. This time we only ate breakfast before taking the shuttle bus to the airport in the morning. The plane departed at 7am and we had to be at the airport at 5am. Wing had chartered [Thomas Cook Airlines](#). We had ordered food on the plane. It was very much better than the food we got at SAS the week before. The onboard service was also better.



[Skiathos](#) is located in the archipelago of the [Sporades](#) and approximately 6,000 people live on the island.

Skiathos was in ancient times a member of the Athenian Maritime Federation. The city was destroyed by [Philip V of Macedonia](#) in the year 200 BC


The island was later under Roman, Byzantine and Ottoman rule.

In the year 1207 AD the [Gyzi brothers](#) conquered the island and built Bourtzi, a smaller Venetian-style fortress. The fortress failed to protect its population from pirates, so in the mid-1300s the capital was moved from the ancient site of today's modern city of Skiathos, to Kastro (Greek for fortress) ([link 1](#) - [link 2](#) - [link 3](#)), located on a high cliff overlooking the sea at the northernmost point of the island.

In the 1830s, the island's capital was again moved back to its original place where it still remains. Today, the ruins of Kastro are a tourist attraction.



We landed at [Skiathos airport](#). The runway there is only 1628 meters long, so only small aircrafts can take off with full tank. Larger planes must replenish at an airport with longer runways. This is often done at the airport in Thessaloniki or in Kavala / Chrysoupoli.



We were going to stay at [Hotel Alkyon](#), which is shown on the map.

Later we went to the nearest supermarket and bought water and beer. We walked through a small park where this statue stands.




In the evening we went to the same restaurant to eat. We sat on the section facing the sea. Here we see the main building.

Here a sightseeing boat comes back.





There were an incredible amount of people and cars going on and off the ferry.




The ferry runways are lowered before the ferry arrives at the dock and the crew makes everything ready for cars and passengers.




Leaving Skopelos.
