
The Sohail Castle lies on a hill beside the Fuengirola river. The hill is 38 m above sea level.

The hill has been used for thousands of years. First were the <u>Carthaginians</u> and then the <u>Romans</u>. The first buildings under the <u>Caliphate of Córdoba</u> were built on the old ruins. Later, in the 1100s, under the <u>Almohads</u>, there was built a defensive wall around it.

In 1485 the castle was reconquered by the Christians. They started a reconstruction by removing one of the east towers to build a canon platform. The south-western part of the walls were reconstructed also, to make room for the bowmen.

The castle was a bit destroyed by Napoleon under the Peninsular War.


Lately the castle is mostly restored by the authorities in Fuengirola and are used for various arrangements in the town.

We can clearly see that it is old.




A flowering plant has taken roots.
