
ST. PETERSBURG THE 19TH, 20TH AND 21TH OF MAY Ballet the 19th of May and folklore show the 20th of May

After having been on a city round trip and then to Pushkin the 19th of May, we also attended to a ballet in the evening. It was to be at the <u>Hermitage Theater</u>.




