THAILAND – HUA HIN WINTER 2016 - 2017


This winter we decided to stay in Thailand. We were in Thailand the winter 2010 - 2011. Then we stayed in Jomtien, on the outskirts of Pattaya.

Now we found a nice apartment in Hua Hin, which we booked from 1 December 2016 to 28 March 2017. We acquired the visa through Visumservice. It costs a little extra, but is a lot easier when everything goes via the web and mail.

We traveled with <u>Norwegian</u> from Oslo the 30th of November in the afternoon. We took a taxi to the train station at Kongsvinger and train from there to Lillestrøm. There we had to change trains. We did not bother to wait for the normal train, so we entered the express train that were ready to depart when we got on the platform. It costs a bit more, so we had to pay the difference to come through the gate.

We traveled to Bangkok.

The main airport which is called Suvarnabhumi Airport.





<u>Suvarnabhumi Airport</u>, also known as (New) Bangkok International Airport, is the main airport in Bangkok. After many delays the airport was opened for traffic the 28th of September 2006.

Suvarnabhumi lies about 25 km east of Bangkok. The name *Suvarnabhumi* was chosen by <u>King Bhumibol Adulyadej</u> and is referring to «the ancient kingdom» that is believed to have been somewhere in south east Asia. The control tower at the airport is the highest in the world (132.2 m). In addition the terminal building is the next biggest airport terminal (563,000 m²), only beaten by Hong Kong International Airport (570,000 m²), but bigger than the South Korean Incheon International Airport (496,000 m²). Suvarnabhumi is one of the busiest airports in Asia.

A bit about **Thailand**

Thai is the name of the largest ethnic group of people in Thailand, and the name of the country is probably to be interpreted as «the land of the Thai people».

The official name was Siam until 1939, and between 1945 and 1949.

The Thai people has lived for immemorial times in southern parts of China, from where they have diverged south and east to Vietnam, Laos, Thailand, the Shan states in Burma and Assam. This migration, which found place through year hundreds, increased when the Mongols invaded China during the 1200s.

Around 1250 the first Thai dominated kingdoms appear in the northern Thailand in the towns Chiang Saen, Chiengmai and Sukhothai. Sukhotai is considered to be the first capital of Thailand.

There were wars both against the Khmer states and against Burma.

The first Europeans – the Portuguese – arrived in Thailand in the beginning of the 1500s.

It is interesting to notice that Thailand has never been a European colony.

Thailand is a monarchy and the King, **Bhumibol** Adulyadej, is the king of Thailand who have reigned longest, and he is immensely popular among the Thai people. He died in 2016 and was followed by Maha Vajiralongkorn.



A little about Hua Hin

Hua Hin is the oldest resort town of Thailand, and it got a boost in the 1920s when Rama VI and Rama VII built summer homes here to escape Bangkok's stifling climate. The construction of the southern railway made many wealthy Thais also to build summer homes by the sea here. In 1980s there were built many large hotels and many foreign tourists started coming. The tranquil fishing village was thus eventually a vacation spot for both Thais and foreigners. Today there are over 70,000 residents here.
