




















This is <u>Pfalzgrafenstein Castle</u>, which we saw the day before from the other side of the Rhine.





The day after we got there, we drove over to Burg Eltz. We had to walk a short distance through a forest to get there. Here I am on my way to the castle.














There are woods on all sides of the castle.


Then we drove over to the other side of the Moselle. Here we are at <u>Thurant Castle</u>.
