

The first people who settled down in North America, migrated probably from Asia, over the Bering Strait from Siberia during the ice age, 10 000 til 30 000 ago. These became the forefathers of the people that later was known as the Indians

The oldest proven European settlements in North America are found in L'Anse aux Meadows on Newfoundland and dates from around 1000, but the Norse settlers did not succeed to create viable societies. The first documented expedition to mainland USA was when the Spanish conquistador Juan Ponce de Leóns landed at Florida in 1513.

There was subsequently established Spanish, French, Dutch and British colonies. Britain's victory in the French Indian war 1754–1763 resulted in that the British could take over new land areas in North America far beyond the original thirteen colonies.

The new territories was placed directly under the British crown, but in an attempt to get back some of the big was expenses, they tried to increase the taxes in the already existing colonies. The resistance against the British rule in the thirteen colonies resulted in the American Revolutionary War 1775–1781. In 1776 the thirteen colonies pronounced their independence. The date of the Declaration of Independence, July 4, is now celebrated annually as America's Independence Day.

During the 1850s the differences between the various states and between then north-states and the south-states. After four years of bloody war the north-states won the war in 1865.

During the 1800s USA expanded energetic westwards an new states were established, while the country received a lot of immigrants from all of Europe. When USA bought Alaska from Russia in 1867, the borders became as they are today.





<u>Baltimore</u> was founded in 1729, and named after baron Baltimore, one of the British founders of the Maryland colony. It is the biggest city in the state of Maryland, and one of the country's most important harbors.

In 1827, USA's first railroad line, Baltimore & Ohio Railroad, was opened in Baltimore. The harbor developed during the 1800s to the second largest immigration harbor in USA, after New York.



Some land areas around Chesapeake Bay was in 1632 given to Lord Baltimore Cecil Calvert, by Charles I of England, and the new colony was named in honor of Henrietta Maria of France, wife of the king. The colony's first capital, St. Mary's City, was founded in 1634 by Calvert's brother, Leonard Calvert (1606–1647).

Maryland is the center for USA's pharmaceutic industry, with basis in the research around the renown John Hopkins University in Baltimore. As a spin-off of the medical industry, Baltimore is also an important center for health related insurance companies. There is also a lot of medicinal research.






One day we went to Washington. This is the <u>The Lincoln Memorial</u>. It was built 1915 - 1922 as a Doric marble temple with a gigantic statue of the American president Abraham Lincoln.

Farther away is the <u>Washington Monument</u> that was finished in 1884. The obelisk is made of marble, granite and sandstone. Between this and the Lincoln Monument lies a long reflecting pool.









This is the <u>lock keepers house</u> from when it was a canal here. The house was built in 1835.

The monuments lies in a park area called <u>West Potomac Park</u>. The numbers are indicating the following monuments:

- 3. National World War II Memorial

- 6. <u>District of Columbia War Memorial (honoring World War I soldiers)</u>
- 7. Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial
- 8. Jefferson Memorial
