Day 4, June 1, we drive first to <u>Badlands National Park</u>.











Next stop is at Devils Tower. This is a restaurant at the entrance to the area.





It is a lava column that came up to the surface 40 million years ago. Later, the looser materials surrounding the column eroded away so that the column is now standing alone. It was declared the first national monument in the United States in 1906. The mountain has been sacred to the Indians who have lived in the area, and there are many legends. Most of them involve a bear. One of the Indian names are bear tipi, and there are several similar names
