
After we had been through security we had prawn sandwiches at the Seafood Bar.


In 1569 the German-Roman Emperor <u>Maximilian II</u> bought a large area called Katterburg. The new name as the area got, Schönbrunn ("beautiful well"), originates from a well that provided water to the palace in Vienna. The construction of the palace began in 1696, and after three years the first event was held in the middle section.




